Dear Parents and Carers,

As we approach the end of the autumn term, it is time once again for us to celebrate all the positive things have been happening across the Federation. You will see from this edition that children, young people and staff in both schools have been very busy this term, both in a wide range of activities at school and also outside in community visits and activities.

Based on a review of our curriculum last year we are clear that your children need to develop skills in situations that are real and meaningful and that encourage them to actively engage in their learning. The skills that we know will best equip your children with the necessary skills for life beyond the school are communication, cognition, independence, physical development and self-care. Our curriculum has three learning strands to meet the differing needs of your children and strives to be responsive to each child and to build on individual strengths and interests within each of these areas of learning.

We have detailed schemes created by a company called EQUALS who employ experts in special needs to develop their schemes.

In order to put the new curriculum in place we are focusing on one area each term, starting with Play and Leisure as the context at QEII and Independence at College Park. These schemes give guidance to staff on teaching all of the above skills in many ways.

In the New Year we will be considering how best to keep you informed about the new curriculum and what your children are learning so that you can help them to learn and practise their skills at home.

We also wanted to keep you informed on the current position regarding the appointment of a new Executive Headteacher for the Federation. The shared arrangements between Andy and Jacqui which were implemented for the autumn term are working well and these will continue until Easter 2020. Governors are using the services of a specialist search agency to assist in identifying and speaking with potential candidates. The agency is confident that this will enable Governors to interview and appoint a new Executive Headteacher in due course. We will, of course, continue to keep everyone updated.

We do hope that you enjoy reading about all the activities that have taken place across the Federation schools during this term, as well as the excellent work of our Training & Outreach team and our Governors. We would also like to take the opportunity to thank all of our dedicated staff who have continued to work extremely hard to support and encourage the children and young people in their learning and development. We are sure that you will want to join us thanking them for all their hard work, enthusiasm and dedication this term.

Finally, we would like to thank you for your continued support and collaboration, which plays a crucial part in our desire to provide the best education and experience possible for our pupils. We wish you all the very best for the festive season and for a peaceful New Year.

Post 16

Post 16+ students have been busy out in the community this term going regularly to Kensington Gardens and over to QE2 to make use of the gym. They also have weekly visits to Costa Coffee to practice their functional skills; and shopping trips to Sainsbury's to buy ingredients, once they've read through a recipe and created their own shopping list. The students have cooked cheesy muffins, bean tortillas, vegetable frittata and leek and potato soup amongst other things.

They've also enjoyed learning about famous places in London and visited both Tower Bridge and the Tower of London where they saw the Crown Jewels that Kings and Queens have worn

over hundreds of years. Students have explored the story Charlie and the Chocolate Factory by reading

We have done some amazing work in Silver house this term! In Literacy we had been exploring two stories: 'Elmer the patchwork elephant' and 'The Gingerbread man' while learning about colours and animals. Also we had been using action words and practicing in requesting motivating story props to improve our communication skills. In Maths we had been practicing learning about 2D shapes, sequencing and matching numbers.

A very important part of our daily practice was the exercise of interaction and social skills: we learnt

how to take turns sharing a toy, how to play alongside our peers, how to request what we need and how to wait for our turn!

Blue House

This term we have enjoyed going to Paddington Park every Friday. Even in the cold we wrapped up warm and made the most out of the playground equipment. Not only did we focus on our motor skills climbing, jumping and swinging. We also were motivated to use key language terms such as,"help, push, pull, faster and slow." We have also been trying to give instructions/ request from our friends by using our communication aids.

Our sensory story this term has been Pirates Love Underpants. We explored different sensory items associated with sea snd pirates. Kinetic sand was by far our favourite as a whole class!

In science we have made Ice pops as well as tasting how ice melts with the warmth of our mouth and tongue.







Pink Class have had a lovely first term. We read the story 'Room on the broom' and we enjoyed exploring the sensory activities like making a potion and learning the sounds animals make. We tried our best practising handwriting and mark making, sometimes using playdough to help develop our fine motor skills. We are also getting better at finishing our independent work during lessons. Going to Forest School each week meant we had the opportunity to explore the world around us in a safe environment, whilst learning how to make a small camp fire and tasting popcorn.



We practised how to make sandwiches and became better at following a visual schedule. Every afternoon we looked forward to brushing our teeth and practising social and play skills during structured play sessions. It has been a long journey, but we have made it so far and we have enjoyed getting to know our new peers and teachers.







Yellow house this term have been very practical in our learning. We have been into our local community meeting uniformed individuals such as the police, London underground workers, shop staff and many more. This has been helping us have a better understanding of the many different jobs available within our community as well as the many different individuals that can help us. As well as this we have also been developing our road safety when in the community and within the class.

Our communication sessions have a mixture of how we interact in specific situations, ordering and sequencing events and lastly making meaningful requests. We practice our writing daily as well as occasionally spelling of words through interactive white board games or flashcards. Some pupils are developing a better understanding of different vocabulary through observation tasks or short stories.

Lastly yellow house have been thoroughly enjoying our gardening sessions where we explore, find and interactive with insects, different plant based material and different gardening tools. We have collected a number leaves and sorted them through identification sheets.

Governing Body

As we reach the end of Autumn term 2019, I am writing to provide an update into what the Governing Board has been working on this term.



The Federation Governing Board is responsible for holding the Executive Headteacher to account for the educational performance of both schools and their pupils. It sets a clear vision, ethos and strategic direction and ensures money is well spent. Over the last few Newsletters we have told you about the three committees that the Governing Board have set up to look at matters in greater depth and detail. These committees report back to the full Governing Board each term. They cover "Resources", "Standards and Achievement" and "Parents, Pupils and Partnerships". This term I wanted to update you on the "Resources" committee.

As chair of the Resources committee, I have been working with committee members, Executive Headteacher, Heads of schools and the Federation Business Manager to ensure that the Federation is the best it can be at providing an enriching and inclusive education for all pupils. At our last meeting in November we looked at termly report from the Federation Business Manager updating on school budgets and expenditure. The members of the committee looked at the report in detail and asked questions.
