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Brief course description:

Children with Complex Needs are found in all schools. In this 21st Century their numbers have grown rapidly due to a variety of causes and changes e.g. Autism, FASD, ADHD, prematurity etc.

These children present new patterns If learning in classrooms. Teachers have creatively evolved new ways of teaching to respond to these more complex learning profiles. The missing piece of the Jigsaw is how to **effectively assess** these children; how to capture their spiky patterns of attainment and achievement.

The Evidence for Learning app has presented a video based approach which enables high quality observations to be made. These can be annotated, tagged and then stored and analysed at timely junctures be educators. This has led to insightful evidence based practice, which has informed parental contributions and interactions.

This day offers participants the opportunity to work with **three trainers** who are at the fore front of these developments linking curriculum, pedagogy and assessment through engagement.
