Training & Outreach Fees and Charges



Westminster Special Schools Training and Outreach is a non-profit service.. We endeavour to keep costs as low as possible while maintaining high-quality outreach and training.

All members of the training team are experts in their field and undertake their own continuing professional development to ensure they are always up-to-date with the latest research in education and special educational needs.







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Autism and behaviour series of training courses

Presented by The federation of Westminster Special Schools Training and Outreach autism advisory teachers.

Do you want to understand more about autism, how to support students to achieve their full potential and manage their behaviour?

This series of courses will:-

- Provide you with a deeper understanding of autism and how it can present
- An understanding of the difficulties people with autism face
- Take a look at challenging behaviour and understanding why it occurs
- Understand Sensory differences
- You will be introduced to strategies to support achievement and manage the behaviour of pupils with autism. For example structured teaching (TEACCH), Social Stories, Structured groups (Lego club), Sensory and emotional regulation (5 point scale)

Part 1*-**Understanding Autism**– This course is run twice a year. You must attend this introductory training in order to access all the other courses in the series.

Assessing and Teaching Social skills

This 2 day course aims to introduce you to all aspects of working on social skills. Alex will cover how to assess social skills, decide where to start and how to develop social skills through different interventions such as using activities, games and stories. She will also talk about the link between social skills, self-esteem and relationship skills and will give practical suggestions for developing skills.
