## Class information

In Pink class, we are very excited of coming back to School after our summer holidays and we are eager and ready to learn!

This term, our topic is 'Food and Farming'. In English, we will focus on the story "Hello, harvest moon". Our students will work on the story throughout answering his comprehension questions and doing their sensory activities related to it!

In Topic, we will be learning about different types of foods, where these foods come from as well as where do they fit into the food pyramid! Alongside these, students will cook a variety of meals promoting healthy foods and lifestyle. In maths, students will learn about different ways of measuring our food and portion sizes, focusing on hands on activities that promote their independence. Lastly, the class will have a continued focus on improving independence, and emotional self-awareness and regulation. We aim to achieve these skills using activities tailored to the students, including sharing, teamwork, and emotion regulation tasks. We are very eager to start the new term and explore the exciting new curriculum with the students!
