SMSC CALENDAR

Intention

The SMSC calendar provides opportunities for the young people at College Park to feel a sense of connectedness to the local, national and international community through shared social experiences.

It supports their **spiritual** development and knowledge and tolerance of others faiths, feelings and values through common creative experiences by highlight and celebrating these. The calendar makes them aware of different cultural makeup of the world as a global citizen.

It supports the child's **moral** development and their involvement in events that explore roles, responsibilities and ethics such as the World Environment Day and Children in Need.

It fosters their **social** development by highlighting class and whole school opportunities where students can participate in a number of events and celebration and builds positive community cohesion through these and an appreciation of multicultural modern Britain.

It references a range of **cultural** experiences such as Remembrance Day and World Cultural Diversity Day and makes full use of College Park's unique multi-cultural community celebrating difference as a strength and recognises common shared values.

School council

All school council dates are included and supports the young people's understanding of the **British values** of democracy and the parliamentary system that we work within. It also includes the West London Inclusive Arts Festival that allows students to participate in a wide range of artistic **and cultural** opportunities.

This is all underpinned by acceptance, mutual respect and the celebration of diversity. An understanding of the rule of law, supporting the skills and attitudes that will allow them to participate fully in and contribute positively to life in modern Britain

Implementation

We understand that for our students to gain familiarity and understanding that both consistency and the opportunity to revisit topics and themes is essential. To support this we intend for the whole school community to focus on up to three events within each school term. This gives greater opportunity for all students to access the topic/theme in a much deeper manner and to allow for a broader and richer experience that can be supported by both trips and onsite visits. This will be coordinated by the senior



leadership team and supported by the pastoral support team and implemented directly by teachers.

Impact

The impact of this approach will mean that there will be a greater opportunity for learners to experience SMSC events and where appropriate to gain knowledge and skills in relation to these so that they have a greater understanding and appreciation of these.
