What are we doing this term?

This half term, Giraffe class will explore Plants and Gardens through practical, real-life learning. In English, pupils will study James and the Giant Peach to develop reading, discussion, and descriptive writing skills. Maths will focus on sorting, measuring, positional language, and multiplication and division through gardening activities. Science will cover plant growth, parts of plants, and caring for living things. PSHE will build responsibility, independence, teamwork, and age-appropriate learning about growth and wellbeing. Geography, Religious Studies, and Life Skills will link learning to where food comes from, seasonal change, cultural views of nature, and developing independence through gardening, food preparation, and safe tool use.
